JUNE INVITATIONAL REGATTA

NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club, Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). For the J/105 class the J/105 Fleet 1 rules will apply.
- 1.2 Rule 40 is changed as follows: All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed.
- 1.3 Appendix V1 (Penalty at the Time of an Incident) shall apply.
- 1.4 The sailing instructions may change additional racing rules.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to the following classes:
 - J/111, J/120, J/105, Melges 24
- 2.2 J/105 Fleet 1 will require onsite crew weigh-in. The Fleet will manage the weigh-ins upstairs in the Sailing Center at the following times, or as set by the Fleet Measurer or their designee.

Friday, June 9 1700-1800 hours Saturday, June 10 0930-1000 hours Sunday, June 11 0930-1000 hours

- 2.3 Eligible boats shall enter by completing the online registration found at www.sfyc.org > On the Water > Racing > Schedule.
- 2.4 The entry fee is \$135, if received by 1700 hours on June 7. The entry is \$185 after 1700 hours on June 7
- 2.5 No entries will be accepted after 1600 hours on June 9.
- 2.6 If fewer than 5 boats in a class are entered by 1600 hours on June 9, SFYC may refund the entry fee and not provide a start for that class.

3 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 3.1 Saturday, June 10 Three (3) races are scheduled with the first warning signal at 1200 hours.
- 3.2 Sunday, June 11 Two (2) races are scheduled with the first warning signal at 1200 hours.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available on June 7, at The San Francisco Yacht Club and on the website, www.sfyc.org.

5 VENUE

The racing area will be in the vicinity of the Berkeley Olympic Circle.

6 COURSES AND MARKS

The courses and marks will be described in the sailing instructions. All marks will be inflatable buoys.

7 PENALTY SYSTEM

For the Melges 24 class, rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.

8 SCORING

- 8.1 Two races must be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.2 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. No scores will be excluded

9 BERTHING

The SFYC guest dock will be available from June 9 through June 11.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 10.1 Competitors should monitor VHF USA channel 65A for on the water communication with the race committee.
- 10.2 Except in an emergency, or retiring from a race, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

11 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded based on the number of boats entered in each class.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
