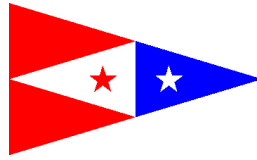

May 18 - 19, 2019

NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: The San Francisco Yacht Club, Belvedere, California

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 For the SFBIOD fleet, the San Francisco Bay IOD Class Rules shall apply.
- 1.3 For the J/105 fleet the J/105 Fleet One rules shall apply.
- 1.4 Rule 40 is changed as follows: All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Flag Y will not be displayed.
- 1.5 Appendix V1 (Penalty at the Time of an Incident) shall apply.
- 1.6 The sailing instructions may change additional racing rules.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to the following classes:
J/105, Express 37, Melges 24, J/70, Express 27, SFBIOD, Knarr.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration found at www.sfyc.org > On the Water > Regattas.
- 2.3 The entry fee is \$135, if received by 1700 hours on May 15. The entry is \$185 after 1700 hours on May 15.
- 2.4 No entries will be accepted after 1700 hours on May 17.
- 2.5 If fewer than 5 boats in a class are entered by 1700 hours on May 15, SFYC may refund their entry fees and not provide a start for that class.

3 SCHEDULE OF RACES

Saturday, May 18 – Three (3) races are scheduled with the first warning signal at 1200 hours.
Sunday, May 19 – Two (2) races are scheduled with the first warning signal at 1200 hours.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available by 1800 hours on May 15 at The San Francisco Yacht Club and on the website, www.sfyc.org.

5 VENUE

The racing area will be in the vicinity of the Berkeley Olympic Circle.

6 COURSES AND MARKS

The courses and marks will be described in the sailing instructions. All marks will be inflatable buoys.

7 PENALTY SYSTEM

For the Melges 24, rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.

8 SCORING

8.1 Two races must be completed to constitute a series.

8.2 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. No scores will be excluded.

9 BERTHING

SFYC guest docks will be available from May 17 through 19.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

10.1 Competitors should monitor VHF USA channel 65A for on the water communication with the race committee.

10.2 Except in an emergency, or when retiring from a race, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

11 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded based on the number of boats entered in each class.

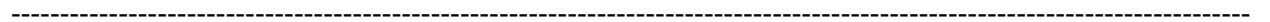
12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY
